### 3. Objectives:

The Ph.D in Nursing (International Program) is designed to prepare its graduates for leadership roles and research careers in academia, the health care industry, and government and private organizations focused on health care. The program objective is to develop scholarly researchers who will advance nursing knowledge and be leaders in nursing research.

To achieve the objective, students in the Ph.D in Nursing (International Program) are educated through seminars, tutorials, and independent research. The completion of a dissertation forms a major component of the program.

Characteristics of the graduate are as follows. They demonstrate:

1. independent rational inquiry, self directed learning, and effective participation in collaborative learning;
2. the ability to design and conduct research studies of relevance and importance to nursing science;
3. the ability to generate and disseminate knowledge relevant to international health care policies;
4. the leadership roles in knowledge management, and nursing innovation and technology development; and
5. commitment to ethical scholarship and collaboration among international nursing research communities and interdisciplinary networks to advance nursing knowledge and health care.

### 4. Curriculum

The Ph.D in Nursing (International Program) is divided into two tracks: Ph.D. by research (Type 1) and Ph.D. by coursework and research (Type 2)

#### 4.1 Total Credit Hours

For Ph.D. by research:

(1) Type 1.1 Program:

A minimum of 48 credit hours is required for master degree holders.

(2) Type 1.2 Program:

A minimum of 72 credit hours in required for baccalaureate degree holders,

Coursework is not compulsory for those who enroll to this program. However, they may have to take some courses, if their advisers find it essential to help them to conduct research effectively. They may take the courses listed for the Ph.D. by coursework and research below, or courses offered by other faculties.

For Ph.D. by coursework and research:

(1) Type 2.1 Program:

For master degree holders, a total of at least 58 credit hours are required.

#### 4.2 Program Structure

4.2.1 Ph.D. by research:

Type 1.1 Program, a minimum of 48 credit hrs. is required for master degree holders. This type of study is designed for proficient researchers only.

Type 1.2 Program, a minimum of 72-credit hrs. is required for honored baccalaureate degree holders.

4.2.2 Ph.D. by coursework and research:

Type 2.1 Program, for master degree holders, a total of at least 58-credit hrs. is required.

Note:

1. The program is available on a full-time basis and designed to attain the completion of studies with the maximum of 6 years for the master degree holders (program type 1.1 and 2.1) and 8 years for the baccalaureate degree holders (program type 1.2).

2. Students must take the qualifying examination in order to evaluate their abilities to conduct research independently and to make judgments whether they are qualified and eligible to submit their dissertation proposals.

3. Those who do not pass the qualifying examination must retake it a second time, in accordance with the faculty regulations. Those who fail to pass the exam a second time lose their status as students.

4. Apart from required courses outlined above, students must take part in relevant activities organized by the faculty.
